

Obituary

Almighty God, in His wise and divine providence, saw fit to call from labor to reward our beloved, Elvare Luvenia Lucretia Smith Gaskin, who departed this life on Wednesday, December 10, 1997, at her home.

Elvare, daughter of the late Mary B. Smith Hewlett and Robert J. Smith, was born in Scotland, Maryland on March 9, 1919. As a child, she attended the Scotland Elementary School and the Cardinal Gibbons Institute. To complete her education, Elvare moved to Charles County, Maryland, where in 1936 she graduated from the Pomonkey High School. Realizing the importance of education, she continued her academic pursuit by studying at the Bowie Normal School, where she matriculated her Teaching Certificate, and at the Morgan State University, where she received her Bachelor of Science Degree in Elementary Education. Elvare pursued graduate studies at the George Washington University, the University of Maryland and the Bowie State University. Her academic efforts lead her to obtain her Advanced Professional Teaching Certificate in Special Education.

While pursuing her educational goals, she began her long and illustrious career of teaching. She started her career at the Gravelly Knoll School in Oakville, Maryland, where she taught first through sixth grades. Elvare's assignments in St. Mary's County included St. Inigoes School, the old Jarboesville School, and the George Washington Carver Elementary School. Due to her potential, she was promoted to serve as the Coordinator of Special Education at the Felix Johnson Education Center and later as the first principal of the Green Holly School. Her last assignment was to serve St. Mary's County as a Pupil Personnel Worker. Elvare concluded her brilliant career after 46 years of untiring public service.

Beyond being a dedicated educator in the Public School System, Elvare was equally dedicated to fulfill her life as a wife and a mother. She was united in Holy Matrimony to her beloved husband, Robert Gaskin, in which they shared a special bond of love, devotion, and understanding. To this union, five children served as the source of joy and inspiration.

An additional source of joy and fulfillment in Elvare's life was her dedication to the church. At an early age she joined St. Luke United Methodist Church in Scotland, Maryland. Later in her life she transferred to Zion United Methodist Church in Lexington Park, Maryland. She gave untiringly of her time and talents. She served the church as: Administrative Council Chairperson; member of the Staff - Parish Relations Committee; Nurturing Ministries Chairperson; Lay Delegate to Annual Conference; member of Outreach Committee; member and president of the Zion Adult Choir as well as the United Methodist Women; and a member of the Board of Trustees.
